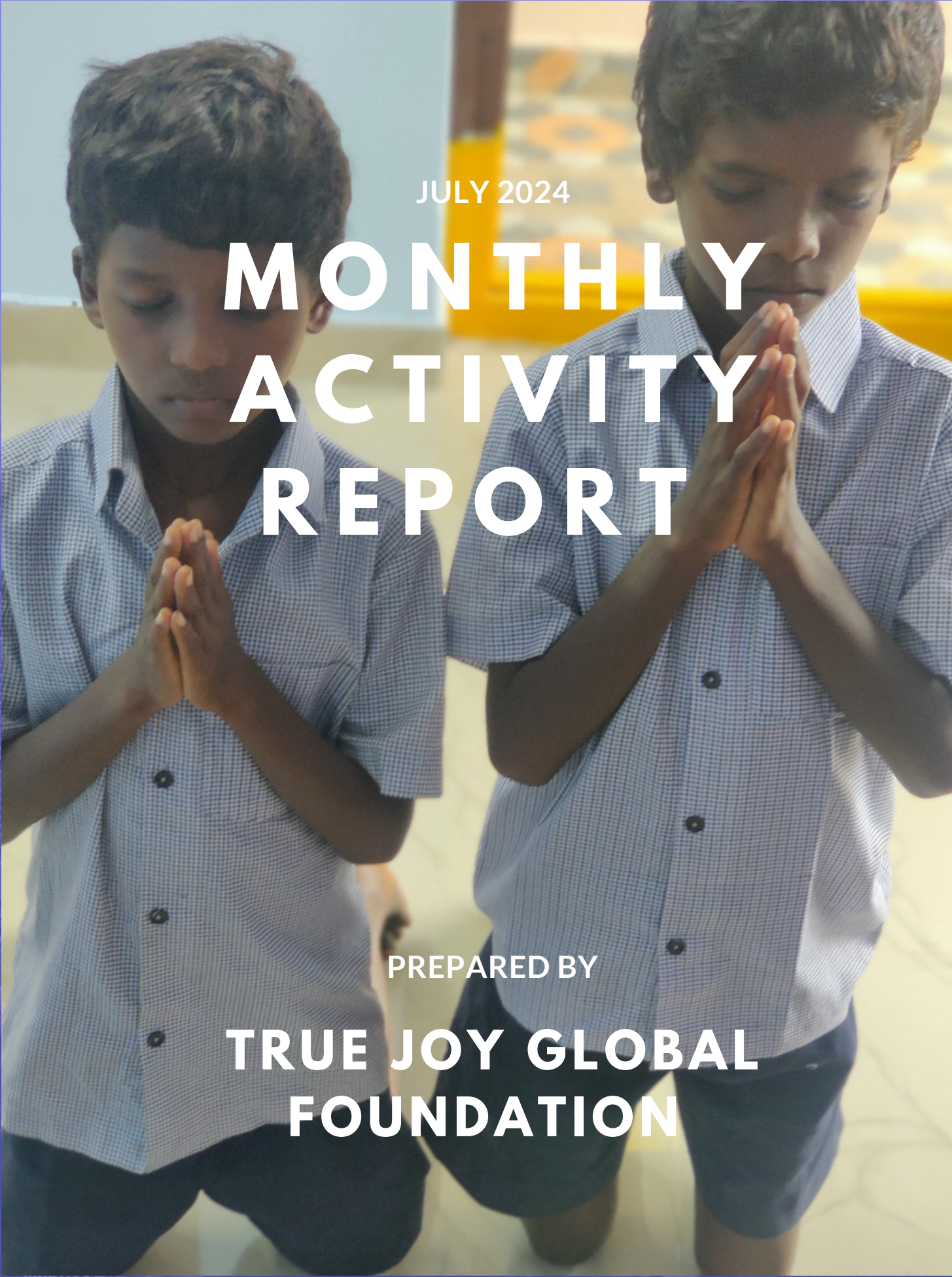

Now, this little girl bears the physical and emotional scars of her father's brutality. Recently, her father not only broke her hand but also kicked her repeatedly in the stomach. Her cries for help echoed through the neighborhood, prompting locals to rush to her aid and rescue her from further harm.

Our hearts broke for Maneesha, and we immediately provided her with the necessary medical care. We also offered her a children's Bible, assuring her that the loving Lord Jesus will one day bring her into safe, caring hands where violence will be no more.
